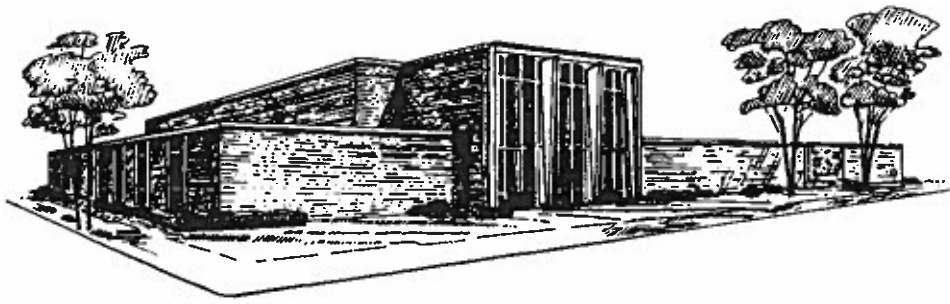


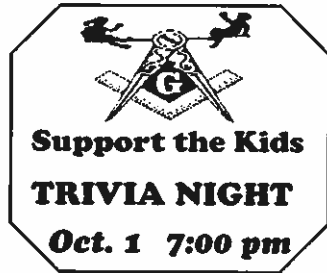

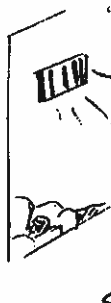
Palmer Past Master Patrick Cholka heads a small cast that delves into the mind and attitude of a man involved in the murder of the most famous persona in Masonic lore.

The event takes place at Palmer Lodge on Saturday, October 22. It begins with a catered buffet supper at 6:00 p.m. A tiled meeting of Master Masons is opened at 7:00 p.m. which seals the lodge for the performance. The play is followed by an interactive discussion among the guests regarding their reactions to the play's message. It is expected the event will close around 9:00 p.m.

This play, the third of four planned Centennial events is offered free of charge to all interested Master Masons. Admission to the tiled meeting will be by dues card only; and guests are requested to bring their own aprons if possible.

"Defense of the Ruffians" is a one-time presentation for Palmer Lodge. AROUND THE LODGE

Kenneth Koula (1952-2011)

On August 30th, funeral services were provided for Bro. Ken Koula. Although not a member here, he was well-known and admired by many Masons from Palmer and Wisconsin lodges. He was a member of LaFayette Lodge #265, where he served many times as Worshipful Master. At the time of his sudden death, he was the Secretary/Treasurer of his lodge.

He was W.M. for several terms while LaFayette met in our Temple. He also served as a Trustee, representing LaFayette well in the Building Association that governed the Temple. At the time when LaFayette was a troubled lodge, he tried to effect a consolidation into Palmer, an effort that ultimately failed in 1986 when LaFayette opted to move to the Humphrey Scottish Rite Center.

Ken Koula will be remembered for his work in providing scholarships to Wauwatosa high school seniors. He led LaFayette lodge participation in the annual Grand Lodge program by providing a \$1,000 award each year to a worthy grad from both Wauwatosa high schools. On alternate years, Palmer and LaFayette lodges took turns sponsoring a recognition dinner for the honored students and their parents. Bro. Koula maintained LaFayette's participation in the scholarship program after his lodge departed the Building Assn.

Bro. Koula was only 59 years old when he died. Many of those 59 years were devoted to Masonry. Those who knew him will surely miss his soft spoken drawl and quirky sense of humor. And those who never knew him will benefit from his relentless service to our Fraternal Order.

CATCHING UP ON DUES

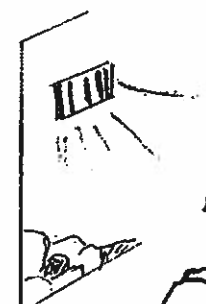
YOUR MASONIC ANGEL FUND
